

KY Foster Youth...By the Numbers

Age at First Entry into Foster Care: Less than 1 year = 1,569

Age at First Entry into Foster Care: 1 to < 3 years = 1,156

Age at First Entry into Foster Care: 3 to < 6 years = 1,890

Age at First Entry into Foster Care: 6 to < 12 years = 1,353

Age at First Entry into Foster Care: 12 to < 18 years = 1,941



Transition to Adulthood: Difficulties

Substantial evidence suggest that these youth, many of whom lack ongoing familial support, are more likely to experience:

- homelessness (Fowler, Toro, & Miles, 2009);
- have poorer outcomes in marital relations and community involvement (Buehler, Orme, Post, & Patterson, 2000);
- have a heightened risk for poor physical health (Takayama, Wolfe, & Coutler, 1998) and psychiatric disorders (McGuinness & Schneider, 2007);
- addiction (Morris, 2007);
- and, have difficulty in obtaining mental and physical health care, (Montgomery, Donkoh, & Underhill, 2006).

Areas of Need

- **Workforce**
- >More flexible (i.e., responsive) IL programming
- > Resources for 21+ alumni (housing, etc.)
- > Reframe the "continuum" of care
- > Research that incorporates the VOICE of youth
